CONDUCTOR

ROUBEN GREGORIAN, conductor, composer, violinist and teacher, was born in Tifliz, Russia, in 1915. Soon after, his Armenian parents moved to a small town near Teheran, Iran, where his father became a violin teacher. Mr. Gregorian's education included Armenian Central College in Tabriz, Iran, the Teheran Conservatory, the Ecole de Musique in Paris, and the National Conservatory of Music in Paris. He was Director of the Teheran Conservatory and Music Director and Conductor of the Teheran Symphony. From 1949 to 1951 he headed the music section of the Iranian National Commission of UNESCO. He came to Boston in 1952, and has since been a faculty member of the Boston Conservatory of Music, where he teaches violin and chamber music, and directs the Conservatory Chorus and the Conservatory Orchestra. He has been the Music Director of the Portland, Maine, Symphony, a guest conductor of the Boston Esplanade Orchestra since 1952, and was Music Director and Conductor of the Boston Women's Symphony. Each year Mr. Gregorian is a guest conductor of the Boston Pops Orchestra. He has conducted for several recordings, and has composed many works, including Iranian Folks Songs and Iranian Suite.

ORCHESTRA MANAGER

WILLIAM MOFFETT graduated from Boston Conservatory of Music in 1971, where he majored in Music Education. While he was at the Conservatory, he studied the trumpet with Gerard Goguen of the Boston Symphony Orchestra, and played in the Conservatory Orchestra under the direction of Rouben Gregorian. Mr. Möffett is in his third year as a teacher in the Milford Public Schools where he teaches string and brass instruments and conducts the Milford All-School Orchestra.

CONDUCTOR

CHARLES H. MATZ received his B.S. Degree from West Chester State University, Pennsylvania, and an M.Ed. from Pennsylvania State University. He holds a Sixth Year Diploma from New York University.

Mr. Matz directed the US Eighth Army Choir in Seoul, Korea, and later served as music director of the Tri Valley Central Schools, Grahamsville, New York. In 1964 he received a John Hay Fellowship in Humanities, in 1967, he was one of eighteen music educators from the nation selected by Yale University to devise a curriculum for music in the secondary schools.

He has served as Chairman of the American Choral Directors Association for the State of Connecticut and has conducted in the States of Florida, Connecticut, Massachusetts, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Rhode Island.

At present Mr. Matz is Choral Director of Norwalk High School, Norwalk, Connecticut, and the College of Mount Saint Vincent, Bronx, New York. He serves on the faculty of the Rhode Island Music Educators Summer Camp at the University of Rhode Island,

CHORUS MANAGER

MRS. GRACE V. RIEDY is the Choral Director at Wachusett Regional High School in Holden and is a graduate of the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston. She has also studie at Hartt College of Music in Hartford, Conn.

Mrs. Reidy is the recording secretary of Massachusetts, Music Educators' Association; she is the 1974 All State Chorus Manager; she has also served the Central District of M.M.E.A. as the Elementary Vice Chairman; Secretary; and Publicity Chairman. Mrs. Reidy is also the Chorus Manager of the Quabbin Valley Music Festival; Secretary of the Quabbin Community Band Auxiliary; a member of the Wachusett Teachers' Association; the Music Educators' National Conference and life member American Choral D. Ascn.

CONDUCTOR

WILLIAM D. GAVER is a member of the music faculty of the University of Massachusetts - Amherst. Early in his career, he was active as a clarinetist performing with the Houston Symphony under Leopold Stokowski. As a public school music administrator, Mr. Gaver has taught in the states of New York, Oklahoma, Texas, and Massachusetts. Chairman of the Department of Music of the Mt. Greylock Regional School District in Williamstown, Massachusetts from 1963-69, he was the founder-coordinator of the Mt. Greylock Arts Festival and conductor of the Mt. Greylock Symphonic Winds. Mr. Gaver's wind and percussion ensembles have performed on numerous occasions at state and national music conventions.

In 1968, Mr. Gaver was selected as one of the ten most outstanding music directors in the United States and Canada by the School Musicians Magazine. He was awarded one of seventeen national NDEA Fellowship Grants in Music, 1969-71.

Mr. Gaver obtained degrees from the Eastman School of Music, the University of Houston, and the University of Missouri - Kansas City. Professional memberships include the College Music Society, the Music Educators National Conference, and the Massachusetts Music Educators Association.

BAND MANAGER

WILLIAM G. McMANUS is the Coordinator of Music for the Westborough Public School System. He began his teaching career in North Syracuse, New York in 1964. In 1969, he was appointed Supervisor of Music in Leicester, Mass.

Mr. McManus graduated from the Boston Conservatory of Music in 1964 winning the Boston Conservatory Alumni Award, He received his Masters Degree from Boston University in 1970. Additional studies include work at Berklee School of Music and Framingham State College.

Mr. McManus was conductor of the 215th Army Band for four years and has been music director of the Framingham Blazers Band since 1967.
