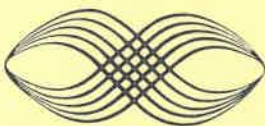

DR. JACK HELLER, CONDUCTOR

Dr. Jack Heller comes to us from the University of Connecticut, where his responsibilities are many and varied. In addition to his post as Professor of Music he serves as Chairman of Music Education, Coordinator of Graduate Studies in Music and Director of the Psychology of Music Laboratory.

Dr. Heller received his undergraduate training at the Julliard School from 1960 to 1965 and was guest conductor of the New York City Ballet in 1966. He took over the musical direction of the Manchester Civic Orchestra in 1967, a post that he currently holds.

Dr. Heller is in demand in Europe and the United States as a lecturer on research in music perception and learning. We welcome him to the festival.



MR. DAVID NYSTEDT, ORCHESTRA MANAGER

Mr. Nystedt is currently a teacher in the Music Department of the Worcester Public Schools, with various instrumental responsibilities on the Junior High and Elementary levels. In addition to his teaching post at Burncoat Junior High, he has served as co-director of the Worcester All-City Elementary String Orchestra. He has also been active for many years in the field of Sacred Music, currently as Director of Music and Organist at Burncoat Baptist Church, Worcester.

Mr. Nystedt attended Barrington College in Rhode Island, receiving the Bachelor of Music degree from Eastern Nazarene College, Wollaston, Massachusetts in 1966.

**GERALD MACK**

Dr. Gerald Mack is Director of Choral Activities and Associate Professor of Music Education at Hartt College of Music of the University of Hartford, West Hartford.

He was Director of Music at the First Congregational Church of Greenwich (Conn.) and Director of Vocal Music at the Greenwich High School from 1955 to 1966. He has also taught at the junior high school level. While serving in the U.S. Army he organized and directed the Fort Dix Soldier's Chorus which made more than one hundred radio and television network appearances.

Dr. Mack studied at the State University College at Fredonia, New York, and at the Eastman School of Music. He received his M.A. and Ed.D. degrees from Teachers College, Columbia University. He is a member of the Music Educators National Conference (MENC), the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA), the International Society for Music Education (ISME) and the Connecticut Music Educators Association (CMEA) for which he serves as choral specialist. He has also served as Connecticut state chairman of the American Choral Directors Association.

He has adjudicated and conducted high school and college choral festivals throughout the East, and in 1965 adjudicated the Hawaiian Music Educators Festival, lectured at the University of Hawaii and conducted the first Hawaiian All-State Chorus. In 1961 his Greenwich High School Concert Choir represented the United States at the ISME convention in Vienna, Austria, and concertized in five European countries. Dr. Mack has appeared at State, Eastern and National MENC conventions as lecturer, clinician and conductor, has published articles in the "Music Educators Journal", and has assisted the Educational Testing Bureau at Princeton, New Jersey in the formulation of music tests for graduating music education students.



**JOHN P. BLACKWELL**

Mr. John P. Blackwell is the Director of Music and Choral Director at Dakmont Regional High School - Ashburnham-Westminster, Mass. He is a graduate of the State College at Lowell where he also received his Masters of Music with a major in choral music.

Mr. Blackwell was choral manager in 1967 and has been Publicity Chairman for the Central District Massachusetts Music Educators Association.

Mr. Blackwell is a member of the Dakmont Teachers' Association and the Music Educators' National Conference. He has also been employed by the Allyn and Bacon Co. as an Educational Consultant.

During the last five years Dr. Mack has conducted all-state choruses throughout the New England states, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Delaware and New York. His Hartt College choruses have been heard over the ABC radio network and in concert, on radio and television throughout Connecticut. He has conducted the Hartt Madrigal Singers and the Hartt Chamber Singers in concert in Washington, D.C., Chicago, Atlanta, and Eastern Division conventions of the MENC, and was a guest clinician for the ACDA at this convention.

Since 1970 he has been conductor of the Greater Hartford Youth Chorale which has appeared with the Hartt Symphony Orchestra, and currently he is Chairman of the Choral Standards and Repertoire Committee for the American Choral Directors Association.

### PROGRAM NOTES

*FANTASIES ON A THEME BY HAYDN* is based on a theme from a piano composition by Joseph Haydn. The three movements are a constantly varied examination of Haydn's basic idea. The bubbly humor of the first and third fantasies flank the second which is intensely lyric.

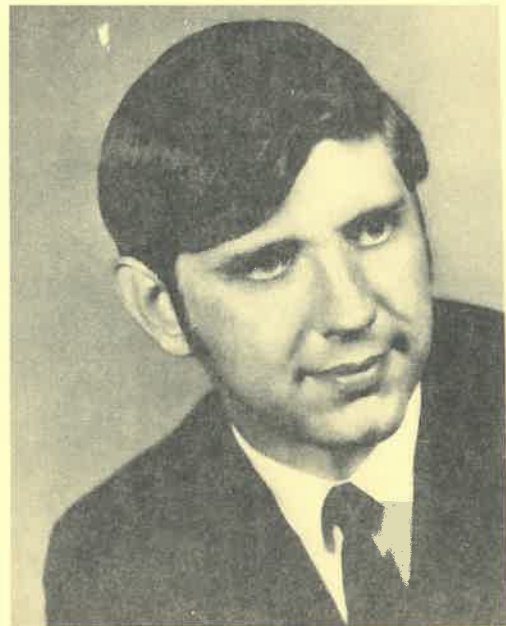
*THREE REVOLUTIONARY MARCHES* were written by the Czech composer Bedrich Smetana in 1848, an inflammatory political time in European history. It is known that Smetana, then a young man of twenty-four, composed these marches as piano pieces while actual street fighting raged in his city of Prague.

*MUSIC FOR WINDS AND PERCUSSION* opens with a rhythmic and vigorous section for winds and brasses punctuated by percussion. Contrast is provided by lyric melodies and warm harmonies in the center portion of the piece. A return of music heard in the first section brings the work to a dramatic and vigorous close.



WILLIAM D. PARDUS, CONDUCTOR

William D. Pardus has been on the faculty of Keene State College since 1966, where he directs both the KSC Wind Ensemble and KSC Jazz Ensemble. A graduate of the University of Connecticut, Prof. Pardus also attended The Hartford Conservatory and Hartt College. His teaching/conducting experience includes public schools in Connecticut, Eastern Connecticut State College, a Fulbright grant to teach and conduct for a year in England, and he was Assistant Conductor of the Manchester (Conn.) Civic Orchestra. He is also active throughout New England as a conductor and adjudicator.



MORRIS H. BLACK, BAND MANAGER

Morris H. Black is coordinator of music for the Spencer-East Brookfield Regional School District. He began his teaching career in Mobile, Alabama in 1969 where, in addition to his regular teaching duties, he was also principal tubaist with the Mobile Symphony. He came to Massachusetts in 1970 as a full scholarship student in the graduate division of New England Conservatory of Music and also as Band Director in Franklin, Mass. In 1971, for a portion of the year, he was performing full-time with the Clyde Beatty-Cole Bros. Circus Band.

Mr. Black is a graduate of Louisiana State University where he was an Honor student in the College of Education and a member of the L.S.U. Faculty Brass Quintet. While at L.S.U. he also played professionally with the Baton Rouge Symphony, Rodeo Bands, and Barnum & Baileys Circus Band.

Mr. Black is also the assistant conductor of the Quabbin Community Band and a member of the Board of Directors of the Salisbury Singers of Worcester.
