MALAMA ROBBINS

Malama Robbins is assistant Professor of Music at Anna Maria College Paxton, Massachusetts where she teaches voice, song literature and choral conducting.

The Anna Maria Chorus under her direction has won many awards. Among these are two for a television program entitled "Christmas at the Worcester Art Museum". It is now shown throughout the country on public television. They are winners several times of the festival-competition of the Catholic Women's Glee Club Association. In 1973, they sang at the Eastern Division Biennial Convention held in Boston, Mass for the Music Educators National Conference. In the Fall of 1974 they represented the State of Massachusetts at "Expo, '74 in Spokane, Washington.

The Salisbury Singers, founded in 1972 have been heard in concerts here and in the country. They have been acclaimed by critics for their choice of repertoire and moving performances. They recently sang at the Worcester Art Museum. That program was heard on the radio and television under the sponsorship of the Freedom Federal Savings and Loan Association of Worcester, Mass.

Professor Robbins studied at the New England Conservatory of Music and graduated from the Longy School of Music, Cambridge, Mass., studied three seasons at the Berkshire Music Institute, Tanglewood where she sang as soloist, premiered several works in the Contemporary Music Series and appeared in the Sunday Morning Bach Cantata series.

She was the chairman and Director of the Junior Choir Festival of the Unitarian-Universalist Churches of Central Massachusetts for nine years which time she was guest conductor for the Connecticut Valley Junior Choir Festival, Northampton, Mass., Green River Valley Junior Choir Festival in Greenfield, Mass., in 1973 directed the Berkshire Junior Choir Festival in the Great Shed in Tanglewood. She taught at the Saint Dunstan College for Sacred Music, Providence, R.I. gave a seminar on hymn singing at the Harvard Divinity School, was chairman of a national competition in search of new hymns for the Unitarian-Universalist Churches, served as adjudicator for choruses and voice competitions.

Professional memberships include, Music Educators National Conference, American Choral Directors Association, American Choral Foundation, National Association of Teachers of Singing and the American Guild of Organists.



ALEXIS V. BLACK

Mrs. Black is a graduate of the Hartt College of Music, of Hartford, Conn. where she participated in many operas and road shows, including "Hansel and Gretle", The Abduction from the Seraglio and the Tales of Hoffman by Offenbach.

She has studied ballet and modern dance for ten years and attended the Hartford Ballet Company while at Hartt. Her opera study and direction has been under Elmer Nagy from Hartt College, Adelaid Bishop at Boston University, and Tito Gobbi of the Metropolitan Opera House. Presently she is the manager of the Massachusetts Central District High School Chorus and the Choral manager of the Quabbin Valley Music Association High School Chorus.

She has adjudicated the Massachusetts Central District Sopranos for four years and the Massachusetts Western District Sopranos for two years.

She has been the Conductor of the Quabbin Valley High School Chorus and the Conductor for the Blackstone Valley Elementary Chorus.

She has directed the Opera Little Red Riding Hood by Barab and performed it at the Massachusetts All-State Conference in Springfield.

She is on the Executive Board of the New and Exciting Opera Worcester.

Since she was ten she has been soloist in many church choirs. She was the soprano soloist at the First Parish Unitarian Church of Fitchburg and is presently a guest soloist in many surrounding churches.

She studied Opera and Voice at the Villa Schifanoia in Florence, Italy under the direction of Tito Gobbi.

Presently she is studying voice at Boston University. She has done graduate work at Boston University. Mrs. Black is presently the Choral Director of Quabbin Regional High School. Where she is the director of seven Choral Groups. She teaches voice at the High School and teaches voice privately at home.

WALTER M. CHESTNUT, *CONDUCTOR*

Walter Chestnut is an Associate Professor of Music at the University of Massachusetts. Besides teaching all the applied trumpet lessons he is director of the University Brass Choir and is a member of the faculty brass trio.

Having received both his bachelor of music and master of music degrees from the University of Michigan. Mr. Chestnut became very active in all branches of music in that area of the country. He was soloist with the University of Michigan Symphony Band and in 1959 was soloist before the National Band Directors Conference in Chicago. He was a clinician, soloist, and adjudicator throughout Indiana and Michigan. From 1959 to 1962 Mr. Chestnut was band director (grades 4 - 12) in Colon, Michigan, and from 1962 to 1966 was Junior High Band and Orchestra Director in Sturgis, Michigan. His Band and orchestras were consistent first division winners in district and state competitions.

Since arriving in the east Mr. Chestnut has conducted All Star Bands in Massachusetts and Vermont, and has served as a clinician at the Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Rhode Island All-State conferences. He is very active as a trumpet clinician and conductor in the public schools of Massachusetts.

Mr. Chestnut has been a member of seven symphony orchestras and was the principal trumpet in the Springfield, Massachusetts Symphony Orchestra from 1967 to 1973. In 1970 he toured Europe with the University of Massachusetts Chorale as soloist and member of the Brass Trio. He was guest artist on the 1974 tour of the University Chamber Singers. He performed in Italy, Austria and Switzerland. In March 1975 he was guest artist with the Worcester Polytechnical Institute Glee Club and toured England playing Piccolo trumpet. He was appointed acting director of the Amherst-Mt. Holyoke Orchestra for the 1973-74 academic year.

Mr. Chestnut is a member of Kappa Kappa Psi, Phi Mu Alpha and Pi Kappa Lambda music fraternities and societies. He is past President of District II Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association. He was selected for membership in the American School Band Directors Association in 1966. He is presently State Chairman of the National Association of College Wind and Percussion Instructors. Professor Chestnut has been a member of the University of Massachusetts Music Department since 1967.



GREGORY C. DEPP, *BAND MANAGER*

Gregory C. Depp is in his third year as High School Band Director, and instrumental instructor in the Clinton Public Schools. In addition to his teaching duties, Mr. Depp is also a free-lance percussionist in the Worcester area.

Mr. Depp is a 1973 graduate of Lowell State College, where he received his B. M. degree in Music Education. While at Lowell, he studied conducting with Mr. Willis Traphagen.
