Mr. Robert J. Lens is the Supervisor of Music in the Auburn Public Schools.

He has earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Music Education at Lowell State College, a Master of Arts degree at the University of Connecticut, and he has also completed a Professional Advancement graduate program in Supervision and Administration.

From 1961-1970, Mr. Lens was the Supervisor of Music in the Spencer Public Schools during which time he directed and taught the Vocal and Instrumental Music Program in Grades one through twelve. Mr. Lens, as well as being a member of A.I.M.E. and B.V.S.M.S., is currently serving as the M.M.E.A. All-State Executive Board Senior High School Member at Large. He is also a member of the Central District Music Association, having served as Treasurer, Chorus Manager, Adjudicator, Public Relations Chairman and as a member of various committees.

His choral groups have won many first place division ratings in District Festivals and he has been a guest conductor for the Blackstone Valley School Music Association Junior-Senior High School Festival.

In addition, Mr. Lens has directed and conducted various summer music programs in Auburn and has taught privated woodwind, brass and piano instrumental lessons for many years.

Leopold Teraspulsky, New Yorker by birth, started his musical career as a 'cellist with a most auspicious New York debut followed by solo appearances in the world's music centers to enthusiastic audience and critical acclaim. A recent sampling of press from London, Berlin, and Chicago include, "rare performance", "Leopold Teraspulsky is a master", "remarkable sensitivity and subtlety".

As principal 'cellist of the Pittsburgh, NBC, Grant Park, Aspen Festival symphonies he has played under such luminaries as Reiner, Stokowski, Bernstein, Beechaum and Casals. In this position he had frequent opportunities as last minute substitute to exchange the bow for the baton. He went on to organize and conduct the Bronx Symphony Orchestra. Recently, he directed the Western District Orchestra at Pittsfield and the Massachusetts All-State Orchestra at the Festival in Hyannis, Massachusetts.

He has taught at the Manhattan School of Music, Roosevelt University, Aspen Festival, Indiana University, and at Present is Professor at U. Mass./Amherst. He has had a singular success working with young people, and is much in demand as teacher, adjudicator, conductor, and clinician at string and orchestral workshops nationwide and in Canada.



Ralph Metcalf, a graduate of the New England Conservatory, has been Director of the Shrewsbury High School Orchestra and String Ensemble since 1965. These groups have been consistently represented in District, All-State and All-Eastern Orchestras. In 1975 the String Ensemble was selected to perform at the All-State Conference in Chicopee.

Mr. Metcalf has also been Musical Director of the CYC Bands of Worcester since 1972.

In addition to being a member of the Worcester orchestra, Mr. Metcalf is a frequent performer with a variety of Worcester area ensembles. He has been manager of the District Orchestra several times and, in 1972, was manager of the All-State Orchestra.

A native of Ohio, Joseph Huszti received his degrees from Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois and assumed direction of the Bakersfield (California) College Choir. This choir toured extensively on the West Coast and in recognition of his work with the choir, he received the Greater Bakersfield Chamber of Commerce Man of the Year Award in 1966.

Mr. Huszti has done additional advanced work at the University of California at Los Angeles, Occidental College, the University of Southern California, the Ohio State University, the State University of New York (SUNY) at Binghamton and the Meadow Brook School of Music. He has studied with Howard Swan, William Vennard and Ewald V. Nolte.

Mr. Huszti is an accomplished violist and has conducted numerous orchestras and chamber music ensembles.

Joseph Huszti is currently Associate Professor of Music heading the choral activities and conducting studies at Boston University's School for the Arts. In the summers, Huszti directs Tanglewood's Young Vocalists Program designed to expand the musical horizons of outstanding high school singers.

Before coming to Boston University, he directed the choral and voice programs at the University of Delaware. In 1971, the Concert Choir of the University of Delaware toured nine European countries and competed in two international choral festivals. At the Koorfest in Holland, the choir was awarded second prize and in the International Musical Eisteddfod in Llangollen, Wales, the choir placed second in the Adult Mixed Choir Division.

In 1965, the Bakersfield College Choir, under Huszti's direction, won first prize in the International Musical Eisteddfod at Llangollen, Wales. This was the first American choir to win the Adult Mixed Choir Division and bring the coveted International Trophy to the United States. President Lyndon B. Johnson held a special White House Press Conference for the choir upon their return to the United States.

Mr. Huszti was awarded the Ecumenical Medal by Pope Paul VI in the Summer of 1965. The choir was afforded a private audience by the Pope.



Barbara Elder received a music education degree from University of Rhode Island. While in college, she received a grant to study chamber music at the University of Exeter, England. Since that time, she has been pursuing studies at the Berklee College of Music in composition. Ms. Elder has worked two consecutive summers with the Metropolitan Music Theater, New Jersey. She is now presently the choral director at Uxbridge High School.

A native of Jackson, Michigan, Peter Demos is conductor of the Wind Philharmonia and Associate Professor of Music at Westfield State College. He holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in clarinet performance from the University of Michigan. He received his Bachelor of Music degree from Michigan State University and his Master of Music degree from Western Michigan University. He has studied clarinet with Keith Stein, Daniel Kyser, and the late William Stubbins. From 1964-67, Dr. Demos' bands and orchestra of the Buchanan Public Schools in Michigan were consistent first division winners in district and state festivals. He has also taught and performed at Western Michigan University, Dickinson State College (North Dakota), and the Saskatchewan Summer School of Arts in Canada. He has served as principal clarinetist with several orchestras in Michigan as well as the WMU Symphony and Wind Ensemble and the MSU Symphony Orchestra. Professor Demos appears frequently as solo and chamber recitalist, guest conductor, adjudicator and clinician throughout the mid-west, New England and Canada. He joined the faculty of the department of music at Westfield State in 1970 and teaches clarinet, conducting, woodwind techniques, as well as conductor of the Wind Philharmonia which has received wide acclaim for its fine performances throughout the Commonwealth and in other parts of New England. Aside from his faculty position, Dr. Demos is a performing member of the Clarinet Consort, and an active member of the National Association of College Wind and Percussion Instructors, the International Clarinet Society, The College Music Society, The Association of Canadian Music Festivals, The Hellenic Musical Society of New England, Music Educators National Conferences, and the College Band Directors National Association. Demos' name appears in the commemorative first edition of the WORLD WHO'S WHO OF MUSICIANS--an international biographical record of achievement in the field of music.



Leonard Faucher is currently Chairman of the Music Department at Algonquin Regional High School in Northborough, Massachusetts. He began his teaching career in Manchester, New Hampshire, where for four years he was Music Director of Manchester Central High School. He was an Adjunct Professor of Music at Plymouth State College and was city wide Director of the Manchester, New Hampshire Model Cities Music Program.

Mr. Faucher graduated from the Boston Conservatory of Music in 1968 and received his Masters Degree from Boston Conservatory in 1975. Additional studies include work at the University of New Hampshire and Worcester State College.

Mr. Faucher is a member of the National Association of Jazz Educators, Music Educators National Conference and Phi Mu Alpha, Professional Music Fraternity.
